Statement of Research Interests:

My research interests involve both written and design scholarship. My written scholarship explores the transformative role of ecology and environmentalism in the discourse of mid-twentieth century landscape design. In particular, I am interested in the way environmental designers of the period sought to reinvigorate the tenants of architectural modernism using design methodologies that incorporated both natural and cultural history. To date this work has concentrated on the process theories and systems thinking of the landscape architects Ian McHarg and Lawrence Halprin. My design scholarship explores the use of layered timelines to reveal how natural processes and human action interact over time to create the complex cultural and physical infrastructures that define the landscapes we inhabit. Both aspects of my scholarship shed new light on the way the contemporary practice of landscape architecture conceives of stewardship, defines sustainability, and structures landscape infrastructure systems.
